1. In accordance with Section 212.055(6)(b), a proposed Resolution requesting that the Supervisor of Elections place the School Board's referendum question on a November 3, 2015 referendum election ballot. In accordance with Section 212.055(6)(b), a proposed resolution requesting that the Supervisor of Elections place the School Board's referendum question on a November 3, 2015 referendum election ballot. Section 212.055(6) of the Florida Statutes provides that the school board in each county is authorized to levy a discretionary sales surtax at a rate that may not exceed 0.5 percent (one-half cent) subject to approval by a majority vote of the electors of the county voting in a referendum. In order to do so, the school board is required to adopt a resolution, which includes a referendum statement that conforms to applicable provisions of the Florida Statutes. Section 212.055(6) further provides that the referendum statement shall be placed on the ballot by the governing body of the county. On June 20, 2015, in accordance with section 212.055(6) of the Florida Statutes, the St. Johns County School Board (School Board) adopted its Resolution 2015-30, calling for a referendum election to consider the levy of a one-half cent sales surtax beginning on January 1, 2016 and terminating on December 31, 2025, in order to fund new school facilities, school safety and security and technological upgrades. Subsequently, in a letter dated July 2, 2015, and addressed to the Chair of the St. Johns County Board of Commissioners (Board), the School Board presented its Resolution 2015-30 and formally requested that the Board place the referendum statement as provided in its Resolution 2015-30 on a November 3, 2015 referendum election ballot. Here, in accordance with section 212.055(6)(b) of the Florida Statutes, the proposed resolution provides that the Board issue a request to the St. Johns County Supervisor of Elections to place the School Board's referendum statement as provided in its Resolution 2015-30 on a November 3, 2015 referendum election ballot. A copy of the School Board Resolution 2015-30 and the July 2, 2015 letter described above are Exhibits A and B (respectively) to the proposed resolution.

2. Public Hearing * Brooks Rehabilitation Bonds. The City of Jacksonville will be issuing its conduit bonds for the benefit of Genesis Health, Inc. (it does business as Brooks Rehabilitation) and its affiliates. Part of the project financed by the bonds is the acquisition of certain licenses and other assets of AmeriCare Home Therapy, Inc. One of AmeriCare's leased offices is located in St. Johns County (at 2730 US1 South, Suites G & H, St. Augustine). Additionally, bond proceeds may also be used to finance improvements at an existing location owned by one of Brooks Rehabilitation's affiliates (at 190 Southpark Boulevard, Suites 100 & 102, St. Augustine). Under federal tax law, the approval of an elected body in St. Johns County must be obtained after a public hearing is held. St. Johns County will have absolutely no liability whatsoever on the bonds, and the bonds will be issued by the City of Jacksonville. Additionally, under state law, an interlocal agreement is required between St. Johns County and the City of Jacksonville.

Public Hearing * NZVAR 2015-02 Canopy Oaks. This is a request for a Non-3. Zoning Variance to multiple sections of the LDC as follows: 1) 6.02.01.B.3.a (use of an Easement in a platted subdivision), 2) 6.04.07.B.1 (Easements serving more than two (2) residential Dwelling Units shall meet all requirements of 6.04.00 (Roadway, Drainage & Utilities Standards), 3) 6.04.07.B.2.a-b (Easements for access shall be a minimum 30 feet wide, with a 20-foot minimum stabilized surface), and 4) 6.04.07.A.3 (previously platted Roadways which have not been constructed are subject to the requirements of 6.04.00. The complete Code citations are included as Attachment 3 of this report. The applicant is proposing a Habitat for Humanity development within the West Augustine area utilizing smaller lots that were platted many years ago. Construction of the roadway to current standards is the catalyst for several of the requests incorporated within this application. At the June 16, 2015 BCC meeting, this item was continued as concerns were raised by nearby homeowners with regard to the ownership of Broach Street. As of the writing of this report the Real Estate Department confirmed the County's ownership, and is preparing additional information that will be presented at the July 21, 2015 BCC hearing.

4. Public Hearing * NZVAR 2015-03 Eagle's Cove. Request a non-zoning variance as provided in Section 4.01.10 of the Land Development Code to allow a site specific Alternate Bald Eagle Management Plan. Request a Non-Zoning Variance to Section 4.01.10, Habitat Management of the Bald Eagle, permissible by Section 4.01.10.E.1.c. of the St Johns County Land Development Code. Specifically the request is to authorize an Alternative Bald Eagle Management Plan that provides site specific protections that include protection zones of 330-feet Primary and 660-feet Secondary zones, restrictions on the timing of development activities, natureblending colors and required monitoring during the nesting season. This request is associated with a rezoning application (REZ 2015-01 Eagle's Cove) to rezone from Open Rural to Residential Single-family (RS-3) to allow for up to 19 residential lots on approximately 9.92 acres.

6. Public Hearing * VACROA 2015-01 - Public Hearing regarding vacating a portion of Shea Lane. The applicant requests the vacation of an unopened, unimproved portion of Shea Lane within the Menendez Park Subdivision, lying between the eastern half of lots 2 & 4 and Menedez Park. Traffic patterns will not be negatively impacted, and no party will be unreasonably affected by the requested vacation. Staff has no objections to the request.

The Applicant also requests a waiver of the limitation of rezoning of land within 1 year of approval. This is a public hearing for REZ 2014-09, known as Beaver Toyota, a request to rezone property from Office & Professional (OP) to Commercial Intensive (CI) in order to expand the sales lot, Staff recommends approval of the request based on the proposal's consistency with the Future Land Use designation of Mixed-Use and compatibility with surrounding properties. The Planning and Zoning Agency heard this item on June 18, 2015 and unanimously recommended approval.

9. *Public Hearing* * MAJMOD 2015-03 CR 210 Self Storage Vinings PUD. This is a public hearing for MAJMOD 2015-03, to add 25,000 square feet of self-storage to the Vinings Planned Unit Development (PUD) on a 2.3-acre parcel approved for a maximum of 50,000 square feet of self-storage. This addition will increase the total non-residential entitlements in the PUD from 150,000 to 175,000 square feet. Staff recommends approval of the request based on the proposal's consistency with the Future Land Use designation of Residential-C and compatibility with the surrounding area. The Planning and Zoning Agency recommended approval a by 7-0 vote during the June 18, 2015 meeting.

10. Public Hearing * COMPAMD 2014-08 Boyd's Landing - Transmittal Hearing. This is a request to transmit a Comprehensive Plan amendment to amend the Future Land Use Map from Rural/Silviculture (R/S) to Residential-B and add a Comprehensive Plan Text Policy to limit the dwelling units to 150. The subject property contains 140.00 acres of land and is located off State Road 13 North. The applicant proposes 150 single-family residential units. This is the transmittal hearing to allow for state and regional agency review. The Planning and Zoning Agency recommended approval at its June 4, 2015 regular meeting with a 5-2 vote.

11. FY 2016 Recommended County Budget Presentation. The annual County budget process requires a number of steps, ranging from its preparation through adoption. Florida Statutes (F.S. 129.03(3) and F.S. 200.065, Truth in Millage ("TRIM") requirements) specify that a tentative balanced County budget must be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners as the next step in the budget process. At this point in time, the FY 2016 recommended County budget has been balanced with expenditures and adequate reserves within each County fund equal to projected fund County Administration believes the recommended County budget revenues. represents a funding level that can reasonably assure the achievement of St. Johns County's operational needs while minimizing the tax impact on its citizenry. Α follow-up Board workshop on the FY 2016 recommended County budget will be scheduled tentatively for July 28, 2015. At that time, following the workshop, the Board will be asked to set the tentative FY 2016 County millage rates in order to accomplish the required mailing of notices of proposed property taxes under TRIM. For practical purposes, once the tentative millage rates are set, they can still be decreased by the Board, but not increased.

12. Briefing on the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Draft of the Imperiled Species Management Plan. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) released a Draft Imperiled Species Management Plan for the conservation of 57 animal species. These are current state listed species on the Florida's Endangered and Threatened Species list. The Plan does not add any new species. Upon completion, 15 species will be removed from the Endanger and Threatened Species list, 5 species labeled Species of Special Concern will be evaluated for removal and the category of Species of Special Concern will be eliminated, thereby potentially leaving 37 species on the list. The final Plan will describe the overall approach for integrated management, will include individual and multi-species strategies and actions, and will describe the coordination and partnership that is needed for achieving successful conservation for these species.

13. Public Hearing * Enactment of Land Development Code Amendments -Amendments to Article III, Special Districts; modifying the administrative requirements of the South Anastasia, Mid-Anastasia, Vilano Beach Town Center, and North Coastal Overlays. This is the 2nd reading and enactment to amend four sections of Article III, Special Districts, of the Land Development Code. The changes pertain to the administrative requirements of the South Anastasia, Mid-Anastasia, Vilano Beach Town Center, and North Coastal Overlays. The amendments standardize language, clarify language, add administrative approval of applications when Design Review Boards are unable to meet, and move membership criteria to bylaws to be adopted by companion resolutions. The South Anastasia, Mid-Anastasia, and North Coastal DRBs heard these proposed changes. The Planning and Zoning Agency heard this item and recommended unanimous approval by 7-0. This item has three (3) companion resolutions implementing the proposed bylaws.

The Bylaws set membership criteria such as interest, experience, profession, and residence. This is the second reading and enactment of the County's towing ordinance, which updates certain outdated provisions of the County's current towing ordinance, bringing it in line with the requirements of the Florida Administrative Code. First reading was held on June 2, 2015.

19. Low-THC Cannabis - Direction for ordinance imposing a ninety(90) day moratorium on Low-THC dispensing facilities and research and draft regulations on the zoning and siting of Low-THC dispensing facilities. During the May 5, 2015 Board of County Commissioners meeting, this Office requested and was granted authorization to explore the issue of medical and low-THC marijuana and to bring back, if appropriate recommended measures should those activities be permitted by State law. The Rule challenge to the application of the low-THC (a/k/a Charlotte's Webb) strain of marijuana was dismissed. This item is to direct the Office of the County Attorney to either i) bring to the Board an ordinance which would institute a ninety (90) moratorium on Dispensing Facilities in order to bring back specific recommended regulations on zoning and siting of Dispensing Facilities; ii) not institute a moratorium and rely on the application procedures and restrictions of the state statute and administrative rules; or iii) continue to research the issue, determine which nursery receives the Low-THC nursery for the entirety of Northeast Florida, and bring back recommended findings at a later time.
