1. Presentation on North Florida TPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) FY 2020/21-2024/25. The TIP identifies all publicly funded highway, transit and aviation projects within the North Florida TPO area. This area includes all of Duval County and significant portions of Clay, St. Johns and Nassau Counties. This report will cover projects significant to St. Johns County.

2. NEFRC Meeting a Forecast of Economic Impacts of COVID-19 on NE Florida. The focus of this presentation is to provide an overview of findings from a recently conducted REMI PI + economic impact assessment that analyzes the effects that COVID-19 is having on Northeast Florida. REMI PI+ is a structural economic forecasting and policy analysis model. It integrates input- output, computable general equilibrium, econometric, and economic geography methodologies. The model is dynamic, with forecasts and simulations generated on an annual basis and behavioral responses to compensation, price, and other economic factors. Jack Shad, Economic Development Project Manager, and Sean Lahav, Resiliency Coordinator, from the Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC), will provide St. Johns County Commissioners with a summary of what was found in the economic impact assessment. Overall, the model suggests that the economic effects of even a "best case scenario" will be severe. Northeast Florida will see effects about 15% more severe than the national average. The model suggests that a 2.7% decline in national GDP will result in the loss of more than 41,000 jobs locally, 4.2% of the workforce. Job losses will likely not be spread evenly across the regional economy but will be concentrated in certain industries. According to the model, Northeast Florida will see the highest percentage job losses in the following industries: Construction, Finance & Insurance, Real Estate, Health Care, Accommodation & Food Service, and Other Services.

7. **REZ 2020-02 Enterprise Rental Fleet Parking.** Request to rezone approximately 0.24 acres of land from Commercial General (CG) to Commercial Intensive (CI) to accommodate additional rental fleet parking for the adjacent, existing vehicle rental business. 8. RFP 20-49; Temporary Staffing Services. St. Johns County Purchasing Department solicited RFP packages from qualified and experienced firms to provide an hourly rate for temporary staffing services and temporary-to-permanent recruiting and placement services. The selected staffing firms shall provide sufficient staff, resources, and facilities to ensure that the County's business is handled in a timely manner in accordance with the specifications. The type of work environment for temporary staff may be, but not limited to, indoor office, outdoor weather and/or field conditions, extreme heat, warehouses, garages, extreme noises, odors, heights, and /or dust. The type of work locations for temporary staff may be, but not limited to, County buildings, Amphitheater, various County parks, Golf Course, Beach, Utility Treatment Plants, and Animal Shelter, in accordance with RFP No. 20-49. The RFP was advertised on March 6, 2020 in accordance with the County Purchasing Policy. Six (6) submittals were received on April 2, 2020. The evaluation committee reviewed the submitted responses and the Personnel Services recommends entering into negotiations with the top two (2) ranked firms. Staff recommends entering into negotiations with 22nd Century Technologies, Inc. and Staffing of St. Augustine, Inc. as the top two (2) ranked firms, and upon successful negotiations, to execute a contract with the recommended firms for Temporary Staffing Services, not to exceed any department's authorized annual budget.


