1. Fiscal Year 2021 Recommended Budget and Proposed Millage Rates. The annual County budget process requires a number of steps, ranging from its preparation through adoption, per Florida Statutes (F.S. 129.03(3) and F.S. 200.065, Truth in Millage requirements). The Truth in Millage (TRIM) process informs taxpayers and the public about the legislative process by which local taxing authorities determine ad valorem (property) taxes. On July 7, 2020, The Board of County Commissioners received the FY 2021 Recommended Budget, balanced with expenditures and adequate reserves within each County fund equal to projected fund revenues. County Administration's Recommended Budget represents a funding level that can reasonably assure the achievement of St. Johns County's operational needs while minimizing the tax impact on its citizenry. An electronic version (in pdf format) of the workbook may be found on the County's website at: www.sjcfl.us/OMB. Following the development and presentation of a Recommended Budget, the County is obligated to provide certain information concerning that budget to the Property Appraiser. This information includes 1.) The FY 2020 millage rates; 2.) The FY 2021 proposed millage rates; 3.) The FY 2021 rolled-back rates; and 4.) The date, time, and meeting place of the tentative budget hearing. This information is placed on Department of Revenue DR-420 forms and forwarded to the Property Appraiser. Those forms provide the basis for the "TRIM" notice mailed by the Property Appraiser to property owners in St. Johns County. The BCC will need to approve proposed Millage rates (see the attached sheet) for the County's TRIM mailing, and approve September 8, 2020 @ 5:01 PM in the County Auditorium as the Date, Time and Place of the first public hearing for the adoption of the FY 2021 Annual Budget. For practical purposes, once the tentative Millage rates are set, they can still be decreased but not increased.

2. Presentation of the St. Johns County Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. The County's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report ("CAFR") requires acceptance from the Board of County Commissioners. The Report is prepared by the Clerk Comptroller's Office. As a final step, the Board should accept the FY 2019 CAFR as audited by Carr, Riggs & Ingram, LLC, the County's auditing firm. The CAFR and SAS 114 letter is available on the Clerk's website, which can be accessed from the County's webpage, at the following link: https://stjohnsclerk.com/clerk-information/financials/county-annual-financial-report/cafr/. The Board will now have the opportunity for any further discussion with the auditors. The County has once again received an unqualified opinion on the fair presentation of its financial statements.

3. The Northeast Florida Fire Watch Council - Fiscal Year 2021 Funding Request. The Fire Watch is a multi-jurisdictional government entity formed in October 2019 by an Interlocal Agreement between Baker County, Clay County, Nassau County, St. Johns County, and the City of Jacksonville to end veteran suicide in Northeast Florida. The Fire Watch provides veteran suicide prevention programs and a mobile app that enables veterans and volunteers to foster positive relationships and ensure veterans get the help they need. The app allows veterans in crisis to quickly receive emergency assistance and connect with local resources and allies that will help build relations and provide one-on-one counseling and support. The Fire Watch is requesting \$25,000 in funding from St. Johns County for Fiscal Year 2021.

The grant funds are for capital assistance and operating costs. St. Johns County's 5307 apportionment for FFY 2020 is \$1,200,000. This is a matching grant for 50% for operating and 20% for capital. Match dollars for operating costs come from FDOT block grants and the County general fund through the adopted annual budget of \$276,489. The match for capital is from Transportation Development Credits provided by the State of Florida. This agenda item is for the approval of the FFY 2020 Program of Projects, approval to submit the grants based on the approved Program of Projects and to recognize the funds in the County's FY 2020 budget.

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


